Case 3, Item 2	Miner's pan, found beside a river in Barkerville, BC, by a young Dr. Chung. An early artifact to be added to the collection.	Artifact
Case 4.1, Item 1	Chinese Head Tax certificate. Instituted in 1885 and was meant to discourage Chinese people from entering Canada after the completion of the Canadian Pacific Railway	Primary Source
Case 2, Item 9	Accounts of Voyages of discovery and exploration including Valdes, Galiano, Malaspina, Cook and Vancouver.	Publications
Case 6, Item 4	The journal of Sir. Hector-Louis Langevin wherein Langevin, Minister of Public Works, observed Burrard Inlet and noted it as a "magnificent harbour", influencing the decision to extend the terminus of the railway 20km westward to Vancouver.	Primary Source
Case 12, Item 1	RMS Empress of Asia Print. Given to Chinese businesses in BC by CPR to advertise passage to Hong Kong. This is the print that inspired Dr. Chung to begin his collection.	Print
Case 7.1, Item 2	Slice of the last rail installed in the transcontinental railway on November 7th 1885.	Artifact
Case 11	Canadian Pacific Posters. Advertising CP travel, lodging, immigration incentives.	Posters
Case 5, Item 6	Photograph of Dr. Chung's father's tailor shop in Victoria, BC. 1923.	Photograph
Case 10	Model of the RMS Empress of Asia. Dr. Chung spent 4,000 hours over 6 years restoring this model in the 1990s.	Artifact
Case 5, Item 8	80th birthday family photocollage. Created for Yip Sang, a prominent Chinese businessman in Vancouver.	Primary Source
