## Introduction

The origins of the UBC Library's Taylor Arctic Collection in the friendship between Vilhjalmur Stefansson and A.J.T. Taylor is described in *Beyond the Arctic Circle*. Basically, Stefansson agreed to look out for fine copies of important works on Arctic exploration and travel, with an eye to helping Taylor build a remarkable library of rare and interesting volumes.

Most items in Taylor's collection were inscribed by Stefansson himself, and most are association copies for other reasons--inscribed by authors, editors, or notable previous owners. Many include tipped-in letters and other added material. Part of the agreement was the provision of explanatory comments--concerning the scarcity and importance of the book, the personalities involved and their place in history. Taylor was a sympathetic friend, and Stefansson was obviously conscious of educating a kindred spirit in his speciality. Stefansson's acerbic and categorical remarks are often delightful.


The collection was donated to UBC Library in 1945-46 and the distinctive Taylor Collection bookplate was designed at that time and inserted into each volume. Stefansson himself visited the Library on November 18, 1947, and signed a few final volumes.

Unhappily, no catalogue was made of the collection as received and the volumes were not kept together. It is feared that some of the less striking volumes left the rare book collection at once and found themselves in the general collection, and so have been lost sight of. Kaye Lamb, the University Librarian of the day, reported some 500 volumes in the collection as received. Here I have located 404 volumes (352 titles).

During the writing of *Beyond the Arctic Circle* I kept an informal list of the Taylor titles I had found in Special Collections Division, but afterwards other projects kept me too busy to pursue the compiling of a Taylor catalogue. Over the years friends would occasionally report some titles I had missed, and a file of slips and notes gradually thickened. In particular Margaret Waddington was my most helpful source, and it is in appreciation of her enduring enthusiasm that I belatedly compile this list, a little guilty that several years of retirement have already passed before I finish.

The call numbers provided here are as accurate as I can make them. No longer at RBSC, I am working from some very old notes and I see from the online catalogue that many call numbers have been substantially revised since 1992, and copy numbers are sometimes elusive. But no doubt helpful staff at RBSC will be able (perhaps with some trouble) to track down the Taylor copy for you. A worthy project sometime for a bibliographer would be to examine the Taylor volumes listed here, track down

corrigenda, and update online records with a note to guide researchers to the Taylor Collection copies. Practically every volume in the collection is a noteworthy association copy and most include an interesting comment by Stefansson: each volume after all was hand-picked for his old friend. Notes on the celebrity owners and presenters, a name index, and transcripts of the Stefansson commentary, would be very useful supplements to this catalogue.
